Dar es Salaam. 13th February 2018: The CEO Roundtable of Tanzania (CEOrt) will host a roundtable discussion at the Hyatt Regency Kilimanjaro Hotel in Dar es Salaam this evening.

Such reforms can reduce the vulnerability to corruption in the public and private sectors, deliver pragmatic solutions and tangible results whilst opening new spaces for productive investment.
